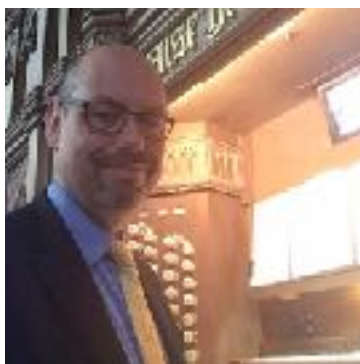


Organ Recital by Ian Dalglish

Bruhns-Prelude and Fugue in E minor

Bach - Chorale Prelude on 'Liebster Jesu, wir sind hier' BWV 731

Couperin - Dialogue sur la Trompette and Élévation : Tierce en Taille from Messe des Couvents

Walther - Concerto del Signor Meck (also ascribed to Vivaldi) (3 movements: 1 Allegro; 2 Adagio; 3 Allegro)

Mendelssohn - Sonata No 6 in D minor, Opus 65 - 1: Choral, Andante Sostenuto; 2: Allegro Molto; 3: Fuga, Sostenuto e legato; 4: Finale, Andante

Vierne - Clair de Lune (Pièces de Fantaisie, Suite No 2)

Vierne - Carillon de Westminster (Pièces de Fantaisie, Suite No 3)

Ian studied organ with David Briggs at Truro Cathedral, winning the Plymouth National Young Organists' Competition in 1990, and then spent four years as Organ Scholar at Merton College, Oxford, where his main teacher, working on early repertoire, was John Wellingham. At Oxford Ian directed the Merton College Chapel Choir, also taking them to the Netherlands on tour. He also conducted the Kodaly Choir and was heavily involved in concerts and choral accompaniment. Following university he spent several years in the London area, including some years as Director of Music at St Paul's, Mill Hill and Organist at Mill Hill School. He moved to the North-West in 2003, since when he has worked as Head of Modern Languages at the King's School in Macclesfield and has also enjoyed working with the school's Foundation Choir. He plays frequently at Sutton St James Parish Church and occasionally St Paul's, Macclesfield.
